 - Year In Review video shown to AGM attendees. Thanks to Ray Estrella for making it.
 - There were 5 families who had their volunteer hours cheques cashed. Concern
 expressed that the volunteer cheque amounts were not high enough to deter families
 from not volunteering. Action: Board to look at increasing the volunteer cheque value.
 - Goalie training will switch from a biweekly session for all goalies to individualized goalie coaching for U11 through U21 every 2 weeks during team practices. Intent is to have individual goalie seasonal development plans. Magic Goalies is the current provider.
 - Discussion about alternate goalie skills providers.
 Action: Phil Piperni to investigate other options for goalie skills providers
 - Goalies at the U7 and U9 divisions will be developed by Jonathan Ho.
 - Ravens will focus on having more female coaches throughout the Association. Certain female players and alumni are already coaching, need to do more to support this effort.
 - Richmond Ice Centre renovations are extending into October. Concerns expressed about impact on practices as well as the October Rep Classic. Will likely have 1 hour (instead of 1 h 15 min for U13 and above) ice times for all age divisions, limited ice cleans, to maximize ice utilization.
 Action: Mark Rustia to investigate options to purchase additional ice slots from September through December outside of Richmond.

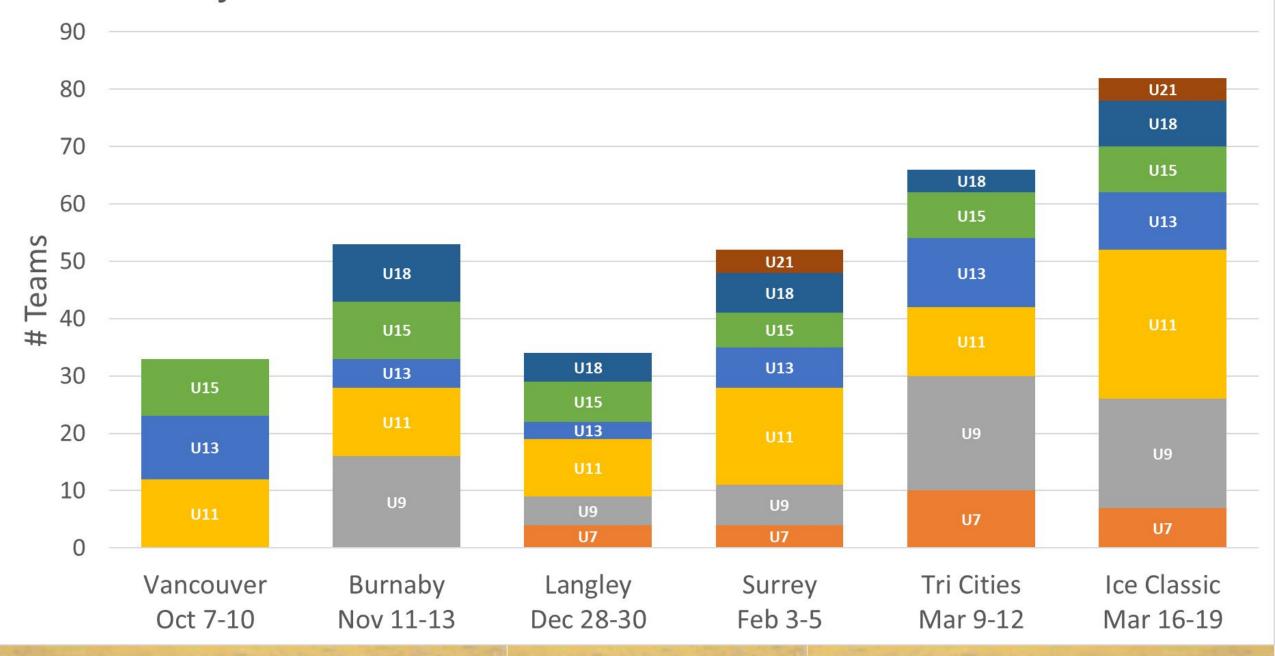

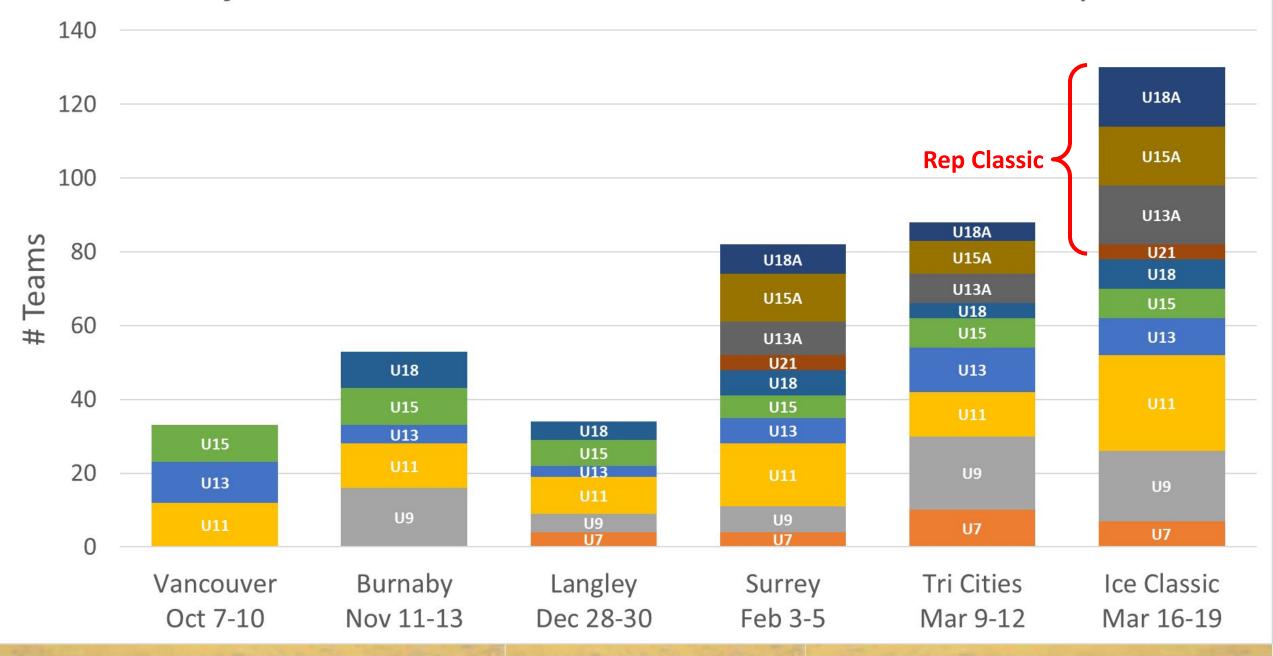
The Ice Classic has been a consistent size for years (since at least 2007). 60-65 teams each year since it became House-only. 70-75 each year before that.



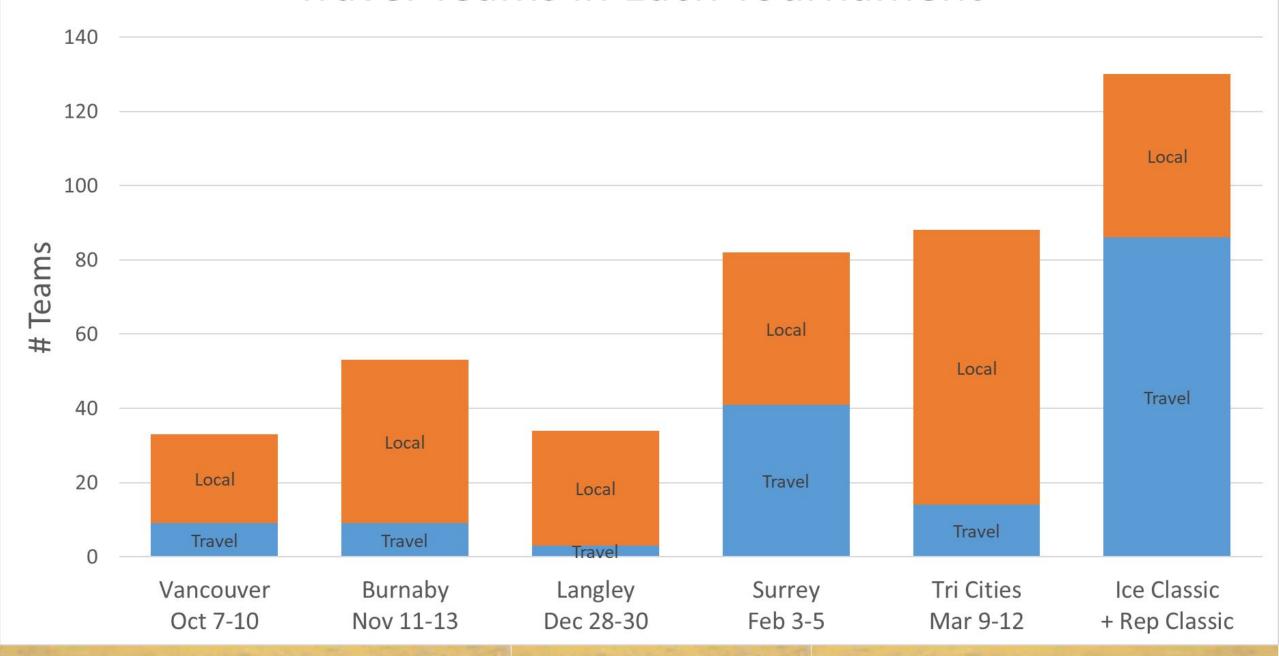
Major Female Tournaments 2022-23 - House Teams



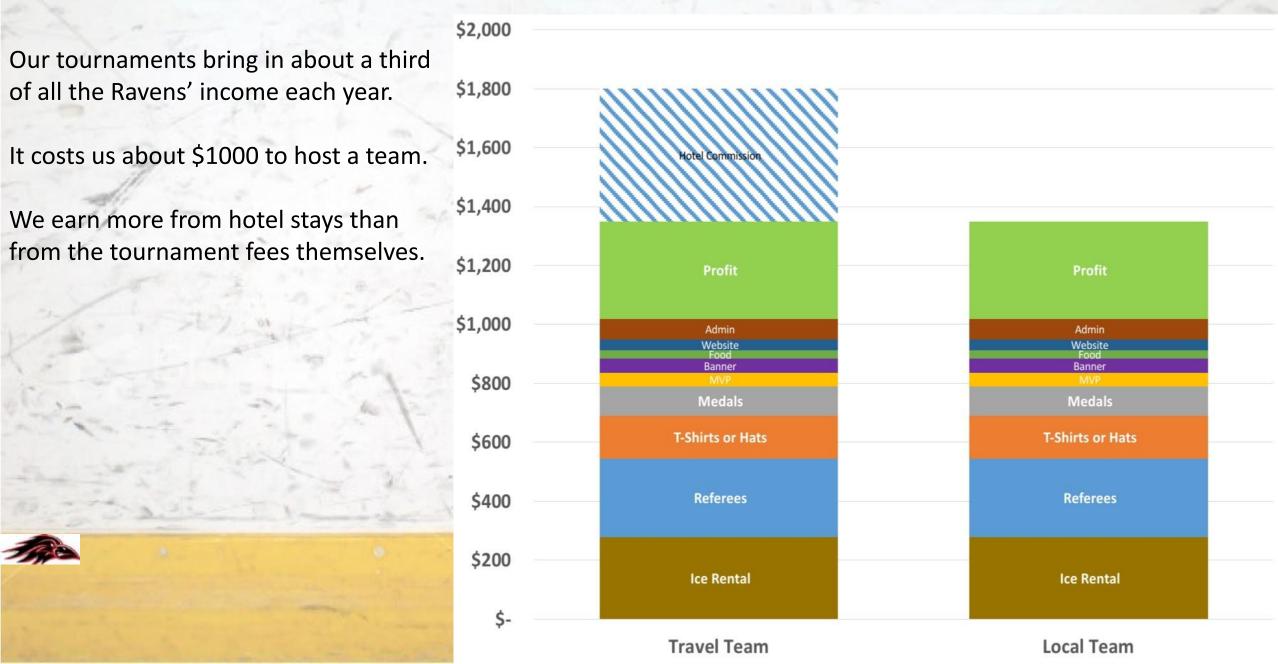
Major Female Tournaments 2022-23 - House + Rep

Tournaments - Financial Picture



Rep Classic - October 21-23, 2022

- Our biggest ever. 108 games for 48 teams. 6 games at Minoru.
- Two-tier format was a success and very popular. Ravens A2 played in tier 2...
- Ravens Medals: U13A1 won Silver, and U18A1 won Bronze
- 3 suspensions. No disputes. One incident of parent misconduct.
- 113 volunteers showed up, 3 did not show up.



Takeaways:

- The Rep Classic is the envy of all other tournaments.
 - There is no other tournament like it in the west, and only a few in the east.
- The Rep Classic's reputation has outgrown the Ravens' capabilities to host it.
 - More than 80 teams were ready to pay last year, but RACA only approved us for 48 teams.
 - Plan: raise the price to match demand (\$2000+) and keep size at 48-56 teams.

2023 Outlook:

Registration opened April 1st, at a higher price of \$1899. 40 teams already registered.



Ice Classic - March 16-19, 2022

- Our biggest ever. 176 games for 82 teams. 4 games at Minoru.
- Lost Gardens with little notice. Solution: Thurs games and late games.
- Ravens medals: U11C1 won Silver, U13C1 won Gold, U13C2 won Bronze
- No major penalties; no disputes; no formal parent incidents.
- 105 volunteers showed up. 5 refused to participate.
- Visits by Drew MacDonald (PCAHA) and Cameron Hope (BC Hockey)



Takeaways:

- Ice Classic has successfully rebounded despite 5 large competitors and a price war.
 - We had a record # teams at U7-U11. Young teams go to more tourneys now.
 - We have not recovered at U13-U18. Older teams go to less tourneys now.
- U7 and U21 are now paying teams, who used to be free & subsidized.
- Ice Classic's success depends on its timing in Spring Break.
- Many coaches/mgrs from 2015-20 still come today. Most bring multiple teams.
- 6-8 extremely loyal associations keep the Ice Classic afloat: Victoria, Campbell River, PG, Seattle...



General Takeaways from the Tournaments

- Thursday games were popular, and a great way to "soft start" each tournament.
- Success with all-female and mostly-female referee squads. Experimented with 4 officials.
- Partnerships with Real Hip Clothing and Northern Element Photography have been successful, and will continue.
- Improved efficiencies since 2020:
 - Electronic registrations (Teamsnap)
 - Electronic payment collection (QuickBooks, Teamsnap)
 - Electronic collection of team paperwork (JotForm)
 - Electronic volunteer shift assignments (Google Docs; room to improve)
 - Electronic scoreboard/standings (Teamsnap Tournaments)
 - Future: automated scheduling



A Note on Volunteering

At registration time, parents agree to perform up to 5 volunteer hours, per registered player, specifically at Ravens tournaments.

Also detailed in Ravens Policy Manual.

Main Risk Related Issues 2022-23 Season

- Cell phone use in dressing rooms
- Lack of injury reporting
- HCSP guidance on team injuries
- · Ensuring Coaches, On-ice helpers, Managers, HCSP certifications in place

Injury Reporting

- 6 concussions/suspected concussions reported
- Low reporting rate only 40% of teams reported injuries.
- Recommendation for an alternate reporting method for the 2023-24 season



Cell Phone Use In Dressing Rooms

- Teams with multiple cell-phone use complaints
- Recommendation for meeting with coaches/managers at the beginning of 2022-23 season to review best practice for dealing with cell-phone use

Feedback from Team HCSPs

- More cooperation/communication needed between HCSP and Coaches/Managers
- · Fully stocked First Aid Kits at the start of the season were appreciated



Next Season

- New Risk Manager for Ravens will work with current Risk Manager to ensure
 continuity
- Explore workshops for Coaches/Parents/Players on supporting and dealing with mental health issues related to young athletes
- Continue to introduce new ways to support team HCSP





The 2022-2023 season saw a full rebound from COVID-19. As a result, we can continue to invest in top programs for our girls as well as invest in streamlining processing for the Association as a whole.

As you will see, the budget to be voted has some key investments specifically related to on and off ice developments of our girls. The tournaments have been very successful, and we have already received registrations for our October tournament.

Below I have summarized from highlights from the financials.



Profit and Loss Statement highlights

- Registration increased over last year. We also saw an increase in Rep fees as a result of an increase to those fees.
- This year we also implemented Raffle Nexus which increased the fundraising revenue generated at both tournaments, and the association raffle. I also changed the way we report these on the income statement to show each fundraising event and it's contra account for expenses. Moving to Raffle Nexus was the last piece to move our association to cashless transactions. We are slowly moving away from cheques as well.
- As Mark spoke to, we hosted two tournaments this year which were very successful revenue generators and we will now be implementing Team Snap Tournaments to assist us in collecting the funds for these tournaments and reduce the administration involved in payment collection.



- We continue to apply for grants throughout the year, specifically the BC Gaming Grant. This past season we received \$45.5k. This year we will be applying for \$80k. We increased the budget for player development and will highlight this in our application this year.
- Online Subscriptions increase due to the introduction of Teamsnap and Google Workspace for Non-Profits
- We invested more in power skating this year and we will be boosting that next season.
- Ice costs are back in line and we no longer have a COVID Surcharges added to the ice sheets. There has been an overall reduction in ice that the team is working on with the city. There is some upcoming closures due to renovations coming up.



- We invested more in Equipment this past season. We began the process of replacing much needed jerseys and other equipment. This will continue going forward.
- BC Hockey and PCAHA fees increased as we no longer have a reduction in fees due to COVID
- PCAHA increased the referee stipend and therefore we saw an increase in the referee expense.



Balance Sheet

- We are doing well as an organization and continue to do well and thrive
- There is a closure of ice sheets coming up. This is why it's important for us to maintain cash reserves. We are able to adapt if needed and, in this case, possibly purchase ice outside of the city
- We have over \$135k in cash reserves
- We also have receivables related to Hotel sponsorships and grants that are still pending to be received from the tournament.

- We had a great turn out in regards to fundraising and using Raffle Nexus. I still remained conservative on the fundraising budget and left it at \$32k
- We added a budget for sponsorships this year of \$8k. The first time since Covid.
- We remained conservative on the gaming grant at \$45.5k even though I will be applying for \$80K this season.
- We added a larger budget for power skating and Development camps this year (overall player development). This will give us the ability to look outside of the City for Ice if necessary and allow for off ice activities as well.



- We increased equipment in alignment with ongoing replacement of gear due to wear and tear.
- We Increased the Stipend for Non-Parent Coaches to \$7500. This is to help us align with other associations and remain competitive in regards to attracting coaches to our association. This cost is absorbed by the Rep Fees which have also increased in alignment with the stipend. The Rep fee is now \$785 for A1. Please keep in mind that the Rep teams can utilize upto \$1000 for dryland training that will be reimbursed back to the team.

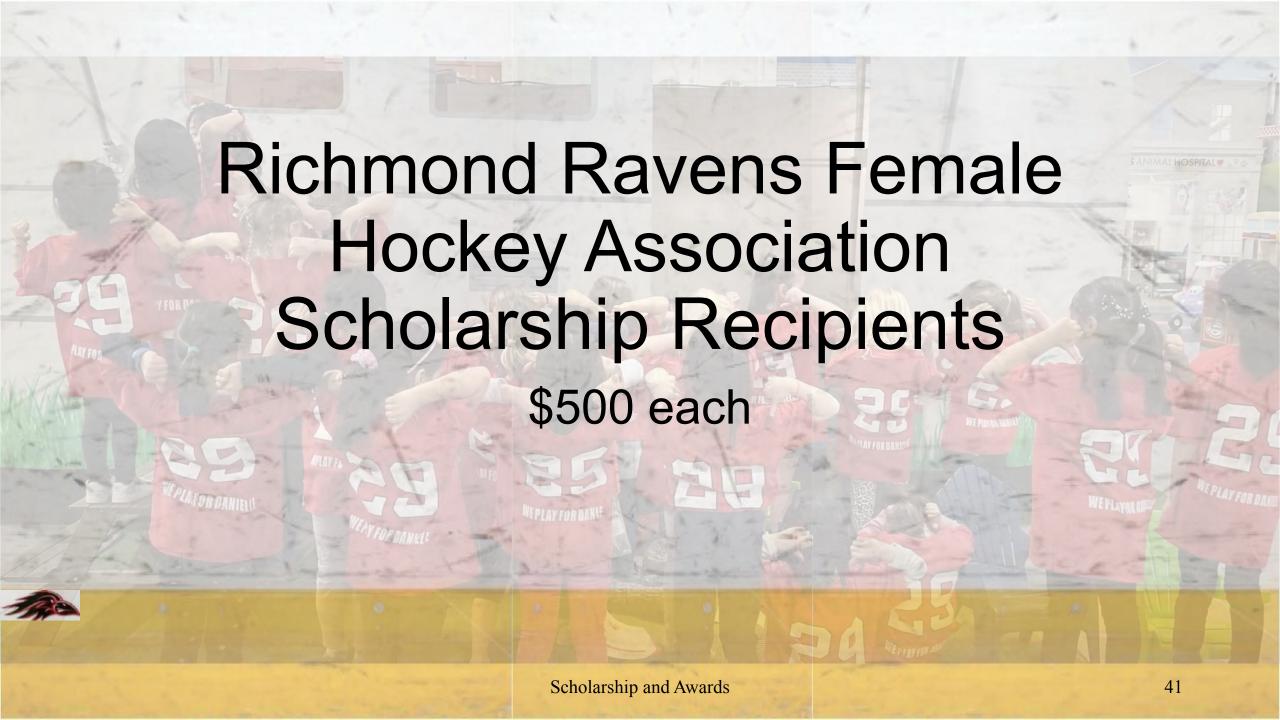
